This 2018 documentary is about one of the most tragic man-made disasters in U.S. history - Flint, Michigan's Water Crisis. In 2014, Flint switched its water supply from Lake Huron to the Flint River as a cost-saving measure. Almost immediately, residents complained of rashes, hair and tooth loss and expressed concerns about Legionnaire's disease, miscarriage, and childhood development. After considerable public pressure, officials belatedly admitted that the water was contaminated. Both Michigan and the federal government declared a state of emergency. Volunteers Needed for MSU Research Study \$50 visa card provided for participation

Michigan State University (MSU) Departments of Computer Science, Engineering and RS&GIS are looking for volunteers to participate in a research study titled, *Physics-driven Modeling and Learning for Person Recognition at a Distance and Altitude.* The objective of this research is to design, implement and evaluate a software system for face, whole-body and gait biometric recognition.

What are my incentives to participating in this study?

- Participants will receive a \$50 prepaid visa card for a single session.
- Your participation will help further advanced research at Michigan State University.

What are my responsibilities as a participant?

- Attend a single data collection session at MSU in East Lansing lasting from 25 to 50 minutes.
- Participants will complete and enrollment survey.

Where and when will the sessions occur?

 Data collection sessions will take place at the Michigan State University RS&GIS offices (1407 S Harrison) and on south campus near the MSU Pavilion (4301 Farm Ln, Lansing, MI 48910) both indoors and outdoors. Sessions will be scheduled from late Summer 2022 through 2025. Session date and time may vary according to availability.*

What data are we collecting?

During data collection sessions, project personnel will collect photographs and videos of participants at
various distances and altitudes. Participants will walk along pre-determined paths while being recorded
by several cameras. Participants may be asked to partially conceal their face or body by carrying items
or wearing accessories or bulky clothing that they have been instructed to bring to their session.

What about my privacy?

• MSU requires all identifying personal information, such as name, address email, to be protected during this project. Information will be stored on a secure computer accessible by data collection personnel only. This information will only be used to schedule appointments, issue prepaid debit cards or contact for future research participation. It will not be attached to any images or videos.
